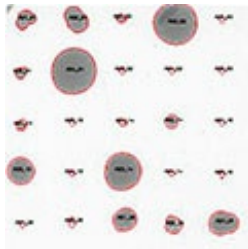


## Genomic detectives crack the case of the missing heritability
