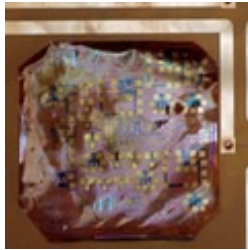


The walls have ears: Electronic walls can listen, and talk

Dolphin research: a student's perspective



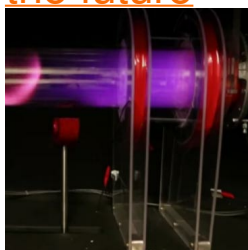
Tara Thean, Class of 2013, describes the journey from identifying her research topic to producing her first research findings, while learning many practical lessons.
